The history of the United States has been shaped by many movements, but perhaps one of the most significant is the Civil Rights Movement. Central to that movement—today and in the past—has always been the city of Montgomery, and the surrounding areas in Alabama. It was here that Martin Luther King Jr. led thousands of nonviolent marchers from Selma to the steps of the capitol in Montgomery on March 25, 1965 resulting in the passage of the Voting Rights Act later that year.

Join Penn Professor Herman Beavers on a journey that begins in Birmingham. Learn about the history of the 16th Street Baptist Church. Explore Montgomery, home to the Rosa Parks Museum, the Dexter Street Parsonage, the head office of the Southern Poverty Law Center, and the newly opened, extraordinarily powerful National Memorial for Peace and Justice. Take a day trip to Selma, the site of "Bloody Sunday," and walk across the Edmund Pettus Bridge, reflecting on the historical events that unfolded here. You will spend three days reflecting on the region's history, sampling southern cuisine, and discussing social justice today. In the words of Dr. King: "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere."



Your 4-Day **Itinerary**



Day 1: Thursday, October 6 Home / Birmingham and Montgomery, AL

Independent morning arrival into Birmingham. Upon arrival, drive to the **16th Street Baptist Church**, the site of the September 15, 1963 bombing where four young girls were killed as they prepared to sing in their choir. The incident caused national outrage and gave rise to a movement that ensured the passage of the 1964 Civil Rights Act. Across the street is the historic **Kelly Ingram Park**, site of civil rights rallies, demonstrations, and confrontations in the 1960s.

After lunch at a local restaurant, visit the **Birmingham Civil Rights Institute**, an interactive museum that tells the story of the Civil Rights Movement. Drive to Montgomery and check into your hotel. This evening enjoy a welcome dinner at a local restaurant. L/D

Day 2: Friday, October 7 Montgomery, AL

Begin the morning with a private visit to the **Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church and Parsonage** where Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was pastor from 1954-1960. Continue on for a visit to the **Southern Poverty Law Center**, a non-profit civil rights organization dedicated to fighting hate and bigotry. Just outside is the **Civil Rights Memorial**, created by Vietnam Veterans Memorial designer Maya Lin. End the morning at the **Legacy Museum: From Enslavement to Mass Incarceration**. Created by the Equal Justice Initiative, the museum explores the history of racial injustice in the United States and the narratives that have sustained injustice across generations.

Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant before visiting the **Equal Justice Initiative's National Memorial for Peace and Justice**. The site is the nation's first memorial dedicated to the legacy of enslaved black people, people terrorized by lynching, African Americans humiliated by racial segregation and Jim Crow, and people of color burdened with contemporary presumptions of guilt and police violence. End the day with a debrief led by staff members of the Equal Justice Initiative. Dinner this evening is at Dreamland BBQ. B/L/D

Day 3: Saturday, October 8 Montgomery and Selma, AL

Begin the day with a visit to the **Freedom Rides Museum**, located in the former Greyhound Bus Station. From here, drive about an hour to Selma and stop at the **Lowndes Interpretive Center** which is dedicated to those who peacefully marched from Selma to Montgomery to gain the right to vote. The historic march, and Martin Luther King, Jr.'s participation in it, raised awareness of the difficulties faced by black voters, and the need for a national Voting Rights Act. Enjoy lunch at the **Coffee Shoppe** and meet with owner **Jackie Smith**.

Stop at the **Brown Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church**, the site of Malcolm X's address in support of voting rights, Dr. King's eulogy for Jimmie Lee Jackson, and Jackson's funeral. Three marches from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama began from this church, which also served as the temporary headquarters for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. Then, visit the **Selma Interpretive Center**, located at the foot of the Edmund Pettus Bridge, where armed forces attacked the first wave of unarmed marchers during Bloody Sunday.

Return along the 54 miles known as the **Selma to Montgomery National Historic Trail** stopping at the **Viola Liuzzo memorial**. Enjoy a farewell dinner at Central Restaurant. B/L/D

Day 4: Sunday, October 9 Montgomery / Home

After breakfast, walk to attend a Sunday church service at the **Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church** where Martin Luther King, Jr. pastored from 1954-1960.

Independent transfers to the Montgomery Airport for return flights. B



Herman Beavers has taught at Penn since 1989. Professor Beavers has a joint appointment in the Departments of English and Africana Studies and teaches courses on African American and American literature, including courses on Southern Modernism, 20th-Century African American Poetry, as well as "Trading Fours: The Literatures of Jazz," which is a requisite course in the Jazz and Popular Music minor. He also teaches a section of the introductory poetry workshop in the Creative Writing Program. Professor Beavers is a member of the Faculty Advisory Board of the Netter Center for Community Partnerships, and teaches the Academically-Based Community Service course entitled, "August Wilson and Beyond," which brings Penn students together with West Philadelphia residents to read August Wilson's Century Cycle of plays. His most recent poems have appeared (or are about to appear) in *MELUS, The Langston Hughes Colloquy, Versadelphia, Cleaver Magazine,* and *The American Arts Quarterly*. He has recently published essays on August Wilson, Charles Johnson, Ralph Ellison, and Toni Morrison. His latest book is *Changing the Order of Things: Geography and the Political Imaginary in the Novels of Toni Morrison* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2018). He also serves as an advisory editor at *African American Review, Modern Fiction Studies*, and *The Black Scholar*.

Tour Price Includes: Accommodations in hotels as outlined in the itinerary based on double occupancy, prices listed are based on two persons sharing a twin room. Distant Horizons reserves the right to substitute hotels for those named in the brochure when necessary. Distant Horizons will do all possible for single participants to satisfy requests to share rooms. On occasions when it is not possible, the single room supplement will apply. If Distant Horizons assigns you a roommate and your roommate cancels or changes their mind about sharing a room, you will be liable for the single room supplement. American breakfasts (B), lunches (L) and dinners (D) are included as specified in the itinerary.
